Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure Report 2017 – 2018

Pupil Premium Grant is national funding provided to schools identified to support narrowing the achievement gap between those young people eligible for the grant and other pupils and students. This funding is not ring fenced to any particular young person, but is ring fenced for the whole school interventions, staff training and support for this group of young people.

There are four categories of young people that qualify for Pupil Premium:

- Children eligible for Free School Meals (or recorded as Ever 6 Free School Meals)
- Children Looked After
- Armed forces children
- Children adopted from care in England (where parents have informed the school).

Allocation of the funding will follow the key aims and principles of the school whilst targeting key groups and individuals within the eligible criteria. The criteria will be based on responses to the school's self-evaluation data on attainment, achievement and progress as well as supportive data and information about the personnel, social, and health and wellbeing needs of individual groups and students who meet eligible criteria.
